## Conservation

Those beautiful, bright red berries we use in greens arrange-



ments are winterberries- Ilex verticillata.

Why not grow a few plants of your own? Take the red berries and let them sit and ferment a short while. They'll get squishy. Remove the fruit to expose the seeds and clean them off. Plant in a larger pot (even one that still has soil from summer), leave outside under a shrub and ignore for the winter. It should start growing by spring.

In a few years you won't need to travel far for those beautiful berries (full to part sun).
