Hello Recyclers!

First of all thank you to everyone who visited the Recycling Table at our Arbor Day Event and thank you to Joyce for all of your hard work making that day possible.

I learned that many children are very aware of the need to recycle and how to help to make our world a stronger and better place. We made many bird feeders from recycled toilet paper rolls and hopefully made many birds happy.

One of the questions I was asked several times concerned the recycling of small appliances. I had no answer but have since looked into this and found a bit of information that might be helpful. First of all, and something I already knew, was if you have a small appliance (iron, toaster, coffee pot, etc) and it works, bring it to us at the Wareham Recycle Drop Off Center (John Dixon Recycle Center) and place it in our Swap Shed. We have many people every week who are looking for certain items. The next step is to donate your item at a donation location or drop it off at a recycling drop off facility. You should not place these items in the trash.
