Just a few updates to think about prior to our upcoming November meeting:

First, thank you to everyone who volunteered to participate in all the planning logistics including workshops, set up/clean up, greens gathering, publicity, etc. It takes a small army to do this and I could not do it without your help.

- If you typically buy your holiday wreath from the fair, you can pre-order (for members), so please let us know at the next meeting so Leslie can take into account. This just helps in the ordering process. You can still buy at the Fair, we'll designate a time for that. You can choose the bow color with your pre-order too.
- All members are asked to bring 2 dozen cookies for the confection table. Elissa and Michele will
 have the bags to give you (at the Nov. mtg.) and will speak on the directions for packaging. Fudge
 boxes will be available at this meeting for those who signed up for making fudge.
- If you are bringing in foods for the fair (other than the cookies and fudge), please bring into the Friday meeting (Dec. 2nd). I believe in the past there have been breads, jellies, etc. and these we will put on the table "Country Kitchen".
- Our themed tables will be:
 - Evergreens (wood box centerpieces)
 - Vintage Finds (centerpieces/vintage items)
 - Coastal (driftwood wreaths)
 - Paper Craft (occasion cards)
 - Confections (cookies/fudge)
 - Boxwood trees
 - Gardening (Christmas bulbs)
 - Rustic Farmhouse (felted mice creations, grapevine wreaths)
 - ◆ Country Kitchen Jellies, Jam, Bread, pine scent bags, etc.)
- All fair items should be brought in on the Friday Mtg. before fair. This helps with pricing and finding space on the themed tables.
