Every autumn, pots of rust and vellow and red mums adorn stores for us to buv and pot. Chrysanthemums have been cultivated since the 8th century in Japan. The mus sold at this time of year are considered annuals, having been fed and pruned multiple times to produce the colorful rounded clumps. They will be too pooped to pop again.

But why not asters? Asters and chrysanthemums are in the family This includes many asteraceae. composite, daisy like flowers such as zinnias and dahlias - annuals and perennials. Asters come back every year and remain true to color. Names can be tough. Sometimes symphiotrichome know as dendranthemum, they fall under the aster category. They grow easily from seed and come with names like 'October Sky'.

If you must have rust or orange, get mums. But the purple, white, pink and blue aster return for a bigger show every year.
